Non-insurance Covered Services: Refraction and Contact Lens Fee

Refraction is the exam that determines the glasses or contact lens prescription through the use of trial lenses and or techniques. The most common method uses the technique of “which is better one or two.”

When seeing an eye specialist, medicare and most insurance companies consider refraction to be a non-covered service that is billed directly to the patient. A refraction fee is usually charged when a glasses or contact lens prescription is given to you. Most new patients will receive a refraction during one of their initial visits.

Refraction Fee \$80

For glasses prescription only

New Patient, New Contact Lens Fitting \$150

Applies to soft contacts with a follow up within 30 days

Existing Patient, New Contact Lens Fit \$100

Applies to fitting of soft contact lens with a follow up within 30 days

Medical insurance billing including deductibles, co-pays, and co-insurance are not included in these fees and are billed separately in addition to the above pricing.
